## Communion Rite

### Reception of Communion

*To receive the Communion Bread, please come to the two stations behind the altar, keeping appropriate distance from others.*

*Please use the hand sanitizer before approaching the Communion minister.*

*Use two cupped hands to receive the bread.  
Step to the side to partake of the bread  
or consume when you return to your place.*

## Prayer of Spiritual Communion

We are the Body of Christ, united in the Spirit.  
We know Christ's presence in the Eucharist, the Word,  
the people of God, and all of creation.  
Sharing Communion physically or through virtual gathering  
unites our hearts and minds that all may be one.

## Clearing of the altar

*The Holy Thursday liturgy ends with the clearing of the altar  
in preparation for the stark liturgy of Good Friday.  
We pass from song to music to silence.*

*You are welcome to remain for personal prayer and reflection  
or exit quietly as our Triduum prayer  
unfolds the mystery of the passion and resurrection of Jesus.*

*The Oratory is also available for meditation.*

Join our prayer with all the holy women and men  
 who have gone before us,  
 especially witnesses of charity and service.  
 May all of us be joined together one day  
 in the eternal banquet with Jesus,  
 our brother.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ... forever and ever.





### The Prayer of Jesus


Holy One, our only Home, blessed be your name.

*Presider* Let us give thanks to our God.


**All It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

he broke it and said:


This is my body for you.
