





Since the 4th century of the Christian era, the veneration of the cross, in some form, has been at the heart of the observance of Good Friday. Accordingly, at this time we invite those who desire to venerate the cross to come forward. This may be done in any way you wish. You can come up and touch the cross or simply stand or kneel for a moment of prayer.

It is not necessary to approach the cross in single file.

Please feel free to come forward with others and in groups.

Our veneration can be a moment of solidarity with the pain of the world, symbolized in the cross of Jesus Christ.
