Presider Let us give thanks to the God of all.


All It is right to give God thanks and praise.



making us a holy people.


Covenant God, we bring you these gifts.

Then he took the cup of wine, said the blessing, and gave it to them saying: "Take this, all of you, and drink. This is the cup of my blood, poured out for you and for all, so that creation may be reconciled. Every time you do this, do this in remembrance of me."

God of the beginning, God of the end, we gather here with all the saints and we remember those who have journeyed beyond life's shore. In your mercy grant them eternal life and peace.

Through Christ, with Christ and in Christ......forever and ever...






